Behind the scenes, there is much activity in putting together a "profile" of our parishes for the benefit of potential applicants to the role of Rector here.

I hope that in the busyness of this time of year you will have time to relax, enjoy all that is around you.

## **TEMPLE GUITING SCHOOL**

#### Lamb Visit

As part of our Science learning we have been looking at life cycles in Key Stage 1. We were offered the chance for some lambs to be brought into school and the chance for children to hold them and feed them. The children were so excited. Everyone got to hold the lambs and to learn about their care and feeding. They asked questions and learned so much – it was a very special afternoon.

#### **Frog Release**

Continuing our theme of life cycles – we collected some frog spawn that we watched each day as the eggs grew, then watched as tadpoles emerged. Class 2 observed them each day as they grew legs and how fast they grew. Then finally the day arrived when they were too big for our tank and so we took then down to our pond so they could grow in to frogs. It was such a worthwhile project.

#### **Cotswold Wildlife Park trip**

The year 1+2 children continued their learning about animal life cycles and habitats with a visit to the Cotswold Wildlife Park. They were able to learn about habitats both at home and further afield. They had workshops on life cycles and caring and feeding of animals at the park and in the wild. The sun was shining and it was a wonderful learning experience.

#### **Kingham Sculpture Festival**

Class 5 have been working with local artist Charlotte Stoneham and the Kingham arts. This year they have designed and created their own insects and then participated in a display including a dragon. The class then went

to see their work in situ at the Kingham sculpture trail. The sculptures were incredible and it was such a fantastic chance to see high quality sculptures in an amazing setting.

#### Year 4 languages day at the Cotswold School

Our Year 4 children went off to the Cotswold School in Bourton on the Water. They had a whole day of language learning - French, Spanish, Ukrainian and other languages. Each language had its own station and activities and our children were given the opportunity to learn new vocabulary and speak a few words in each language – what a wonderful opportunity!

#### Swimming pool on site

We have hired a large swimming pool that arrived on our site in hundreds of pieces, but this was quickly put together and a gazebo erected over the pool. It is 35 feet long and 12 feet wide. It took 4 days to fill and 3 days to heat. It is amazing and every child has had at least 5 lessons during the week. It is such a great way to learn to swim without even leaving the school grounds.
